



## Easy Peasy Knitted Mitts - a Guide to have fun with

Instructions are a guide - adjust to suit thickness of wool or size of finished mitts, differ the length of ribbing (can be just a couple of rows to make dinky ones)

Work 2 strands of thinner wool together

- Always jot down how many rows in order to make the second mitt the same size
- Thicker wool guide is in brackets

Cast on 38(32) stitches using 5 1/2 mm (6mm) needles

Single rib (knit 1 purl1) 6(4) rows - or more if longer cuff wanted

Stocking stitch (knit 1 row purl 1 row) 14(12) rows

Next row (knit row) knit 12(10) then cast off 4(3) knit to end

Next row (purl row) purl to cast off stitches and then cast on (by turning work ) or knit into same stitch if possible 3 or 4 times purl to end of row

To make a matching pair on next mitt knit to last 15(14) stitches then cast off 4(3) knit to end and follow as above from green instructions

Stocking stitch 8 (5) rows

Then single rib 4(3) rows - or more if you want to come higher up fingers slightly

Cast off in single rib

Neatly sew or use grafting method to join side seams

- Buttons can be added/ribbon threaded through/crochet flowers sewn on/different stitches used - such as moss stitch or cables/fringes added

Remember each pair will turn out to be a different size but will suit differing hand sizes - men like the larger ones and girls like smaller ones!
