## RECIPE

### **HIGHLANDERS**

100gms (4 ozs) Butter;  
50gms ( 2ozs) Icing sugar  
75gms ( 3ozs) self-raising flour  
75gms (3ozs) plain flour  
25gms (1 oz) Demerara sugar

Heat the oven to 180 centigrade (350 fahrenheit) (gas Mk 4).  
Cream the butter and sifted icing sugar until they are very light.  
Sift the flours together and work in to make a dough;  
knead thoroughly. Form the mixture into a sausage and roll in  
the Demerara sugar. Wrap in cling film or foil, place on  
something flat and put in the refrigerator for at least one hour.  
Cut into 5mm slices ( quarter inch) and place the biscuits on  
ungreased baking sheets. Bake for about ten minutes.  
Be careful that the edges do not burn. Remove to a wire rack  
and leave to cool.
